There was discussion about the new governance procedures which will be presented at the Convention. The main purpose of the change is to have the National Board of Directors concentrate on National policies and leave the running of the National office to the Administrator. Presidents of the Branches would have more input as they would meet every year and replace the present Convention which is held every three years. The Board of Directors would be reduced to 10 members, one for each region, rather than the present 15 members.

Associate members are by definition members of the civil service, RCMP or Canadian Forces who are nearing retirement. They can get the insurance provided by Medoc but the coverage will only be provided to members of the family and not the Associate member who is already covered by their employer.

The 50/50 draw winners were Madeline Blythe and Rick Baker.


The Westerly gift certificate was won by Stan Bass.
